



From Manual Coordination to System-Driven CDP Reporting

Executive Summary

CDP reporting becomes increasingly difficult to manage as organizations scale across regions, business units, and systems. While the required data often exists, it is typically distributed across teams and platforms, with ownership, workflows, and validation processes managed separately.

This fragmentation creates operational challenges that affect both efficiency and confidence in reporting outcomes. As organizations manage CDP alongside annual reporting cycles, regulatory disclosures, and stakeholder requests, internal teams often face growing workload pressures with limited capacity.

Addressing these challenges requires more than incremental process improvements. It requires a structured approach that connects data, ownership, workflows, and submission into a unified operating model.

Organizations that adopt this approach move from manually coordinating reporting activities to executing them within a controlled system.



Where CDP Reporting Breaks at Scale

As CDP reporting expands across the enterprise, several challenges consistently emerge:

1. Fragmented Ownership & Workflow Execution

Ownership may be assigned across teams but not consistently managed at the KPI level. Work often moves through spreadsheets, email, and offline trackers, limiting accountability and slowing execution.

AI-assisted capabilities can help reduce this operational burden by accelerating response preparation, surfacing missing inputs earlier, and reducing repetitive work across reporting cycles.

2. Disconnected Data and Duplicative Effort

Required information is often spread across systems and consolidated manually. Similar data frequently needs to be collected, reviewed, and reformatted across multiple frameworks, consuming valuable time while increasing workload and the risk of inconsistencies. For many organizations, CDP reporting also overlaps with annual sustainability reporting, CSRD, TCFD, GRI, and other disclosure obligations that rely on similar underlying environmental data but require different formats, workflows, and submission requirements.

3. Limited Visibility and Late-Stage Pressure

Progress is difficult to monitor in real time; validation processes are delayed, and teams must balance overlapping deadlines with limited internal resources. As a result, submission readiness is often confirmed late in the cycle.

These issues are interconnected. When ownership, data, and workflows are not aligned within a single system, coordination effort increases and control decreases.



The Shift: From Coordination to Execution

Improving CDP reporting requires a shift in how it is managed across the organization.

In many environments, reporting is still treated as a coordination exercise. Progress depends on follow-ups, manual handoffs, and disconnected tracking methods to keep work moving across contributors. As reporting demands grow, this approach becomes increasingly difficult to sustain.

A more scalable model treats CDP reporting as an execution process. Work is structured, tracked, and validated within a system that connects contributors, data, and workflows.

This shift enables organizations to:

- Establish clear ownership across all reporting components
- Track progress continuously rather than periodically
- Integrate data directly from source systems
- Apply consistent validation before submission
- Maintain visibility across the entire reporting lifecycle

The Operating Model for Scalable CDP Reporting

Organizations that successfully scale CDP reporting implement a structured operating model built on five core components.



KPI-Level Ownership

Ownership is defined at the level where work is performed. Each KPI and questionnaire section is assigned to a specific contributor, with clear accountability and deadlines across the reporting cycle.



Structured Workflow Execution

Workflows guide how reporting activities move from assignment through review and approval. Contributors understand what is required, when it is due, and how work progresses through validation stages.



Connected Data Pipelines

Data required for CDP reporting is integrated from sustainability, EHS, and enterprise systems. Instead of manual consolidation, information flows directly into the reporting process and can be reused across multiple disclosure requirements.



Real-Time Visibility and Control

Dashboards provide continuous insight into reporting progress. Teams can identify what is complete, in progress, or pending across contributors and regions, allowing issues to be addressed earlier in the cycle.



Submission Alignment

Reporting outputs are structured to align with CDP requirements, enabling efficient preparation for submission. Validated data, prior responses, and supporting narratives are organized in a format that supports direct transfer into the CDP portal.

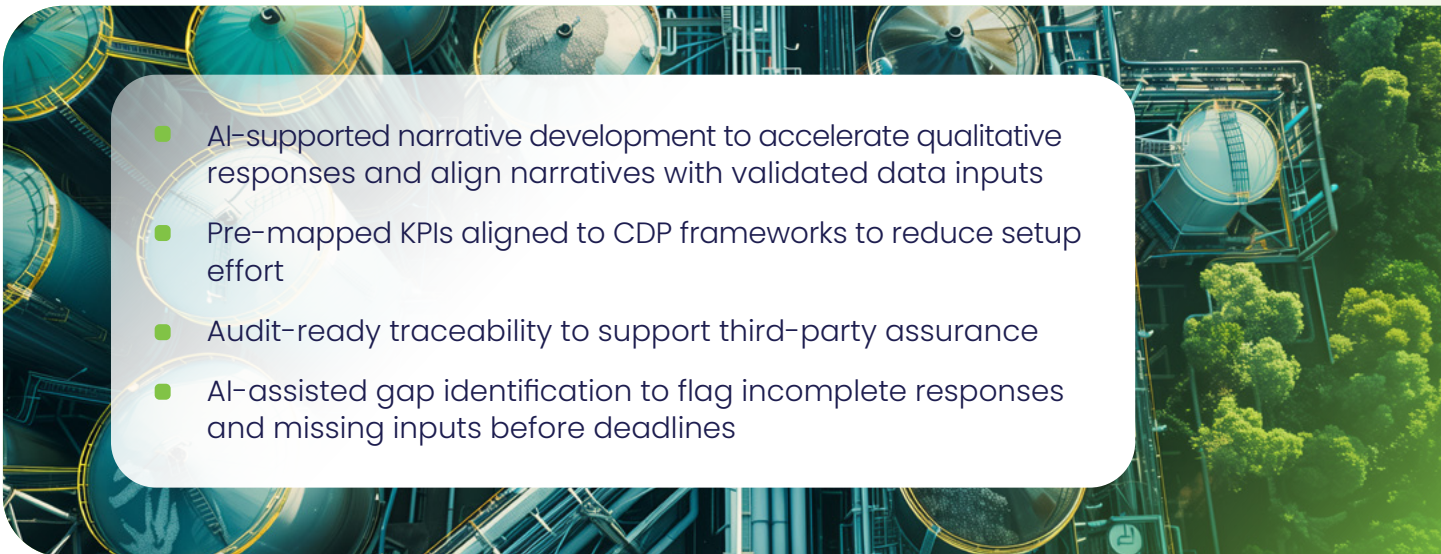


What This Looks Like in Practice

When these components are implemented together, CDP reporting becomes a structured, repeatable process. Organizations are better positioned to:

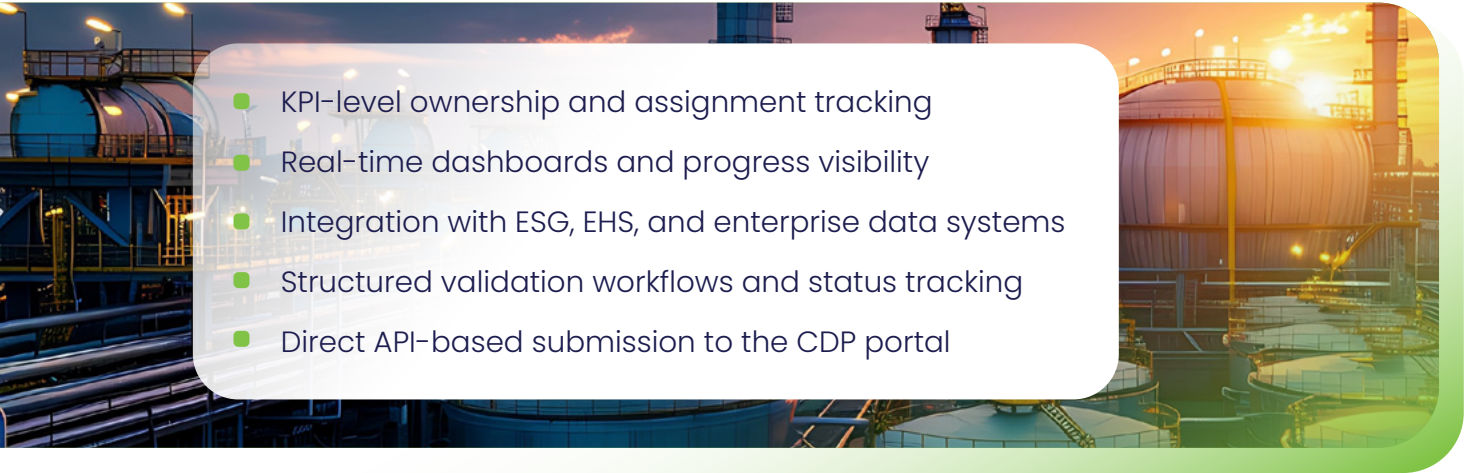

Technology Requirements for Enterprise CDP Reporting

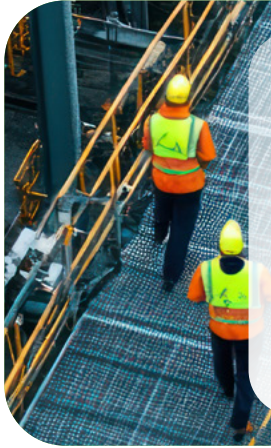
Organizations evaluating solutions to support CDP reporting should look for capabilities that enable structured execution across the full reporting lifecycle.

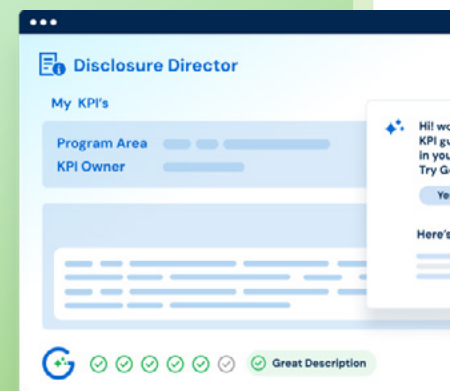
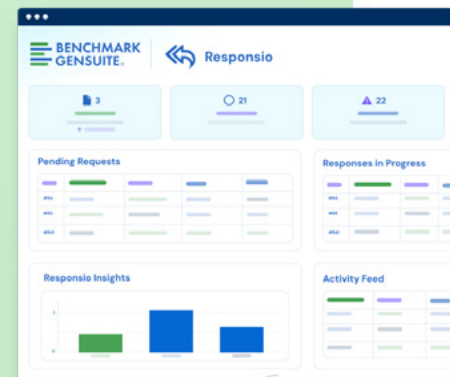
